School and Community

Arvada is a growing northwest Denver suburb dedicated to education, technology, arts, and recreation. The city is home to 113,500 people. Pomona High School is a comprehensive four-year high school with an emphasis on academics, arts, and athletics. Pomona is a 2017 Silver Medal School in *US News and World Report*, ranking in the top fifty high schools in Colorado. The school calendar is 185 days in length, composed of two semesters. Students take classes on a modified block schedule. One hundred and thirty-three staff members work with Pomona students each day. Of those, 80 are certified teachers. The percentage of faculty with advanced degrees is 65%. Five assistant principals, five counselors, and a social worker provide students support services. The graduating class of 2017 had 340 students.

Pomona provides AP, CU Succeeds, Colorado Christian University programs in which students can earn 3 or more college credit hours per course. We have a complete 5A Athletic program with multiple state, regional, and district awards. Pomona offers over thirty Career and Technical Education (CTE) courses. We are nationally recognized as a High School of Business. And our Pomona Arts and Humanities (PAH) Program is a performing and visual arts program that is state-recognized. Pomona has an expanding core of Advancement Via Individual Determination (AVID) elective classes.
